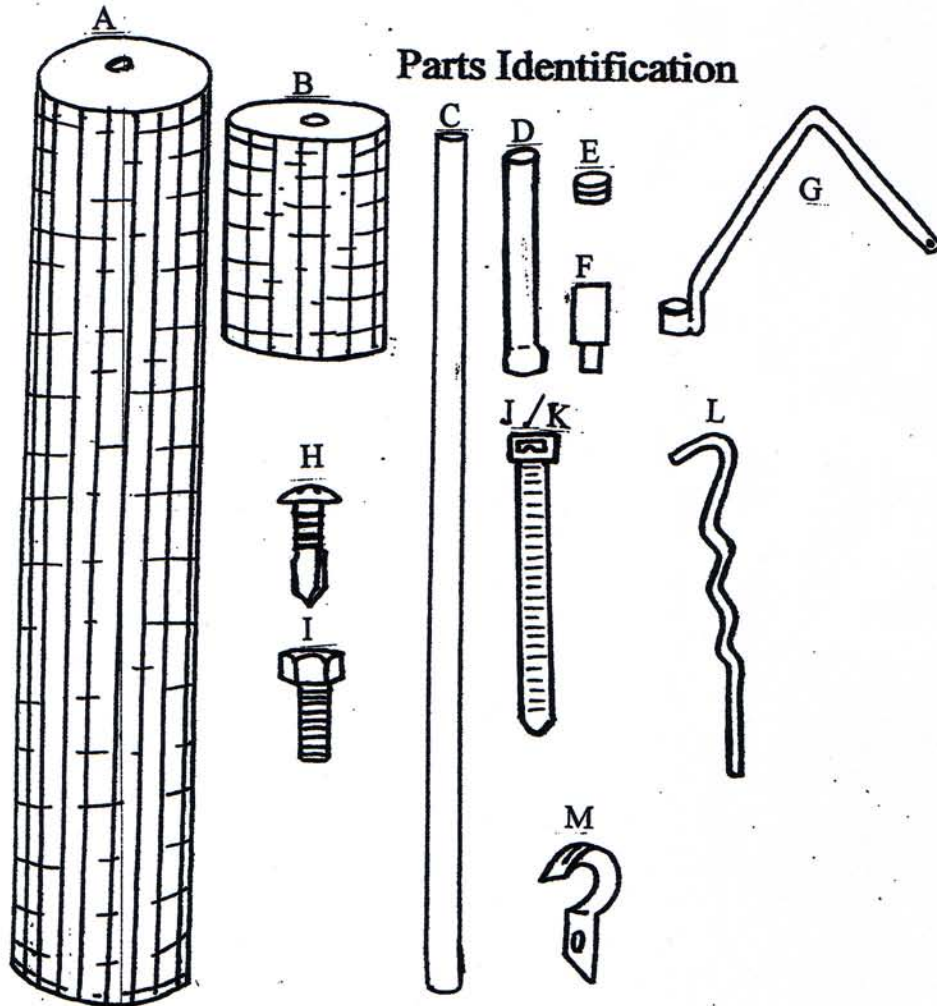

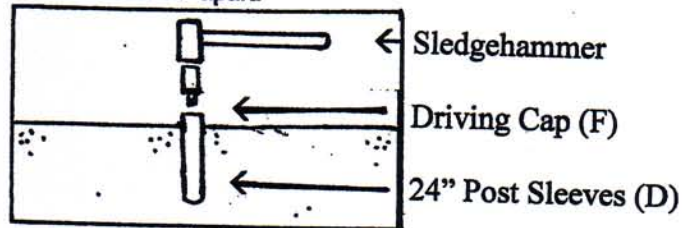
Tools you will need:

__ Sledgehammer __ Drill w/ #2 Phillips Bit __ String and Stakes (for string line) __ Tape Measure
 __ 1/2" Socket or Adjustable Wrench __ Step Ladder __ Hammer Optional: Tie Puller/Cutter,
 Hogringer/Hogrings (Both recommended for larger projects and available from Purr...fect Fence).

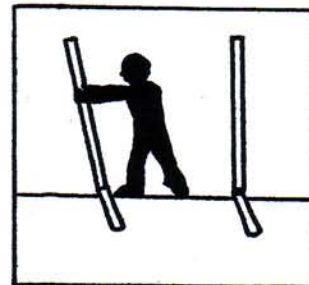
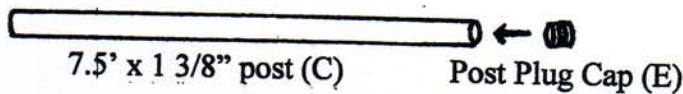
Note: It is very important to determine where every post is to be located before beginning the installation. Posts are to be positioned no more than 14' apart. Make sure to layout your fence line and post placements completely prior to beginning installation. Please view video for details. Posts need to be located at all changes in grade and at every turn in the fence. Please see the sketches below.

Instructions

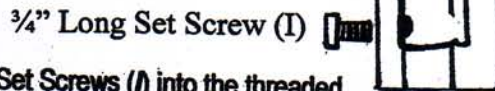
1) Drive your Post Sleeves (24" long pointed steel tubes (D) into the ground using a sledgehammer and the Sleeve Driving Cap (3" long piece of solid milled steel (F) leaving the sleeve 1 1/2 inches above the ground surface. Sleeves should be set no more than 14' apart.



2) Insert the Post Plug Cap (E) into one end of the post. Slide the uncapped end of the post into the sleeve. Secure the post in the sleeve by using a drill with a Phillips bit to drive (2) of the Self-Drilling/Tapping Screws (H) through the sleeve and post on opposite sides of the post/sleeve to keep it from turning. If any post is not plumb, gently pull on the post to bend it until it is straight. Repeat this process for each post.

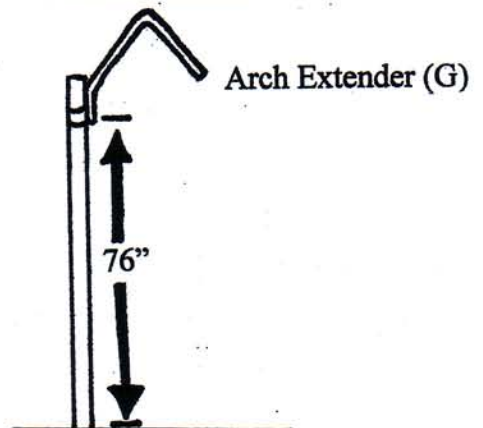


ADJUSTING POLES WITH UNEVEN INSERTS



3) Screw the 3/4" long Set Screws (I) into the threaded hole in each extension piece located on the ring of the piece.

4) Slide the ring of the Arch Extender (G) over the top of every post so that the extension is facing inward and upward (the extension should make an up-side-down "V"). Secure each extension 76" from the ground surface. Whenever the fence line turns, the extension should split the angle (a 90° turn in the fence should have an extension at 45°)

 Extension at 45 degrees.

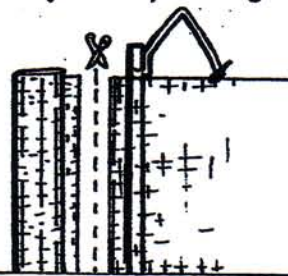


FOR CORNER

5) Tighten the Set Screw (I) that is through the ring of the extension until the end of the bolt is snugly against the post and the arch does not rotate.

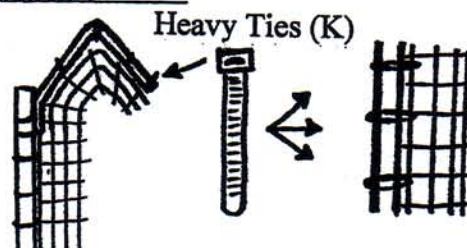
6) Attach the top of the poly fence (the clean edge with no cut offs) to the end (tip) of each arch extender (end of the extender furthest from the post) using the existing hole in the extender for the Light Zip Tie (J). At each major bend in the fence line, cut the fence and restart. When the fence turns, make sure that there is enough fence to reach the post. *Example: A 90° corner will have an extension at 45°.* (If you cut the fence at the edge of the extender, the fence will not reach the post. Run the fence past the extender several inches and eye up the fence in relation to the post before you cut it.) See diagram below and video.

7) Once the clean edge of the poly fence material is attached to the tip of each Arch Extender, attach the fence to the top inside of the up-side-down "V" (DO NOT attach the fence material on top of the arch extenders), and then to the bottom of the extension just above the post juncture using the Heavy Ties (K).



8) Attach the fence to the posts using Heavy Zip Ties – 3 for line posts, and up to 15 for corners or any at any posts where fence was cut and re-attached due to slopes or angles.

Note: There will be a gap of 16" or more between the bottom edge of the fence and the ground. The Wire Mesh (B) Rodent Barrier (1 3/4" x 1 3/4" PVC coated galvanized welded wire) will overlap the upper portion and secure the bottom of your cat fence.

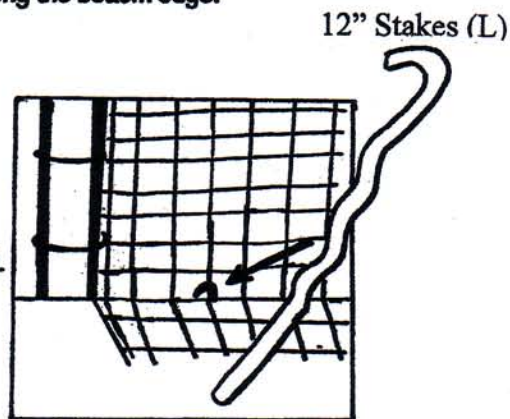


9) Unroll the 2' x 100' PVC coated wire mesh (B). Overlap this material over the poly fence about 4" (2 squares of fence) and attach it to the fence using Light Zip Ties (J) (or hogrings on larger enclosures) at every other square along the top edge of the overlap, and at 12" intervals along the bottom edge.

10) Crease the wire mesh where it meets the ground so it lays on the ground surface on the inside of the enclosure. The wire mesh may need to be cut and/or folded at certain posts to accommodate the bends and angle changes in your fence. Be sure that any cuts are seamed with zip ties or staked firmly to the ground.

11) Stake the wire mesh to the ground with ground stakes (L) about every 2'. Tap in with a hammer until flush with the ground.

Note: Zip tie tails and extra fence that has overlapped at the corners and angled slopes should be trimmed off for a neater appearance.
